We are happy to present the 3<sup>rd</sup> circular of the 12<sup>th</sup> ISKM 2019. Our call for papers had a good feedback and already we have received many contributions from all over the world, which promise a highly interesting conference. The deadline for submitting abstracts is 30 September. Information on accepting communications will be sent before the end of the official registration.

The preliminary conference program will be announced after the end of registration (15 October).

Late registrations are possible at the venue (on 18-22 November) with a higher fee (250 Euro full on-site registration, 125 Euro for students and accompanying persons).

The conference fee includes conference material, social events on 17 and 19 November, refreshments during the conference and excursions on 21 November to knappable raw material outcrops in Budapest environs.
